

# Tips to detect and apply to EU funding

FUNDING TOOLBOX - January 2024

### **Objective of this document**

This document aims to guide you through European programmes to find calls that are of interest for you and help you apply to them.

It is therefore divided in three main parts:

- How to find EU calls for project
- How to apply to a European fund (with links to existing materials and tips)
- How to contact your National Contact Points (NCP).

### Where to find EU calls for projects

#### HORIZON EUROPE

Horizon Europe calls are **collaborative calls**, where at least three partners from three different countries should work together on a proposal. Therefore, these proposals are **usually not coordinated by SMEs**, but SMEs are encouraged to participate in existing consortia.

For the built environment, most interesting calls will be found in the cluster 4 ("Digital, Industry and Space") cluster 5 ("Climate, Energy and Mobility") and in cluster 6 ("Food, Bioeconomy, Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment").

The Built4People Partnership is co-programmed with HE cluster 5. The calls aim at supporting the sustainability of the built environment, through a more circular and human-centred approach. Around €400millions will be dedicated to these calls by the EC (until 2027).

Specific calls are also labelled "New European Bauhaus"(NEB) to support the initiative. These calls support the concrete transformation of the built environment and associated lifestyles at the local level. They can be found in different clusters: cluster 2, cluster 4, cluster 5, cluster 6 or the calls dedicated to the EU Missions.

There are two ways to find calls from Horizon Europe:

- Read the current Horizon Europe Work Programme. Horizon Europe Work Programmes present all the calls that will be available in all cluster for the next two years. You can find the <u>Work Programme 2023-2024 here</u>.
- Search key words on the <u>EU Funding&tenders opportunities platform</u>. There you can refine your search based on the funding programme, and submission status.

#### LIFE

The LIFE programme is the EU's funding instrument for the environment and climate action. Organisations can apply by themselves or in a consortium, and participation of SMEs is encouraged. The projects funded are generally demonstrations and close to market projects. They can address all types of stakeholders: research Institutes, companies and local authorities.

#### EIC ACCELERATOR

The EIC Accelerator supports companies (principally SMEs, including start-ups) to scale up high impact innovations with the potential to create new markets or disrupt existing ones. It provides a combination of funding from EUR 0.5 to EUR 17.5 million (composed of a grant + investment components).

Two different "calls" are organised each year (with four different cut-off dates): an open call (companies working on all topics can apply and by funded) and a challenge call where only companies working on the yearly specific challenges can apply. In 2023, the New European Bauhaus was one of the EIC Accelerator challenges.

### Where to find EU calls for projects

#### EUROSTARS

Eurostars, as part of the European Partnership on Innovative SMEs, is co-funded by the European Union through Horizon Europe, and national funding agencies. It supports **collaborative R&D projects (led by an SME)** creating innovation products, processes or services for commercialisation.

The beneficiaries of Eurostars are funded directly and each by their own national funding agency. Therefore, the eligibility criteria and funding level may differ from one party to the other.

#### CASCADE FUNDING

Cascade funding calls are financed by European projects themselves, with public funds. Each project will define the eligibility criteria and pre-requisite for the applications to its funding opportunities.

Cascade funding projects can be found on specific projects websites, and are all gathered on a specific page on the European funding&tender opportunities portal.

#### **INNOVATION FUND**

The Innovation Fund will provide around €38billion of support from 2020 to 2030 for the commercial demonstration of innovative low-carbon technologies. This is done through calls for large and small-scale projects focusing on: Innovative low-carbon technologies and processes in energy-intensive industries, including products substituting carbon-intensive ones; Carbon capture and utilisation (CCU); Construction and operation of carbon capture and storage (CCS); Innovative renewable energy generation; and Energy storage.

Calls for both large-scale and small-scale projects can be found <u>on the EC funding</u> <u>portal</u>.


### **Applicants guidelines**

Below are the most reliable sources to understand what are the main sections of a proposal, what inputs you should highlight, and what are the main evaluation criteria.



#### What is the role of a NCP?

National Contact Points (NCPs) are national structures established and financed by governments of the 27 EU member states and the associated states ("third countries") to the Horizon Europe and Innovation Fund framework programmes.

NCPs provide guidance, practical information and personalised support on the spot and **in applicants' own languages** on all aspects of **<u>participation in Horizon Europe</u>** <u>and Innovation Fund</u>.

The NCP systems can vary from one country to another from highly centralised to decentralised networks, and a number of very different actors, from ministries to universities, research centres and special agencies to private consulting companies.

In general, the following basic services are available in accordance with <u>the NCP</u> <u>Guiding Principles</u> agreed by all countries:

- Guidance on choosing relevant topics and types of action
- Advice on administrative procedures and contractual issues
- Training and assistance on proposal writing
- Distribution of documentation (forms, guidelines, manuals etc.)
- Assistance in partner search

Beyond sharing information, one of their role is to enable potential applicants to identify and engage with organisations to form a consortium, shape the direction of future Work Programme and understand policies, standards and legislation important to their specific area of interest.

Please keep in mind that as NCPs are national structures, the type and level of services offered may differ from country to country

From both the Funding and Tender portal or the Horizon Europe NCP portal, the easiest way to find your NCP is to select your country as well as the function either linked to your specific R&I area or to specific questions. For instance, select:

- NCP coordinator if you are hesitant on choosing relevant topic or function
- Legal and Financial aspect to address a legal or financial question

Country	Organisation responsible for NCPs
Finland	The Research Council of Finland and Business Finland act as Finland's national contact organisation for Horizon Europe. The NCP responsibilities are divided as follows: the Research Council has the main responsibility for Horizon Europe Pillar 1, Excellent Science, which includes the European Research Council (ERC), Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) and research infrastructures. In addition, the Research Council has the main responsibility for clusters 1 (Health) and 2 (Culture, Creativity and Inclusive Society) under pillar 2, Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness Research Council science advisers are also active in NCP and expert roles in other parts of the programme. A community has been set up on LinkedIn. In Finland, the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment is hosting the Innovation Fund NCP.
France	In France, NCPs mainly are ministries and clusters representatives. They gather <u>on this website</u> . Follow their social media accounts to stay informed! <u>PCN Climat Energie</u> , <u>PCN Industrie</u> , <u>PCN Transports</u> , <u>PCN Innovation Fund France</u> , <u>PCN ERC France</u> ,
Hungary	In Hungary the work of NCPs is coordinated by <u>the NRDI</u> <u>Office</u> .
Italy	In Italy, <u>APRE</u> is hosting the Italian NCP for Horizon Europe. Follow them on <u>LinkedIn</u> . <u>EU ETS Italia</u> is hosting the Italian NCP for Innovation Fund.
Spain	The <u>Spanish Horizon Europe portal</u> , which is jointly managed by the <u>CDTI</u> and the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT), serves as the official channel of communication and information for participants and potential stakeholders in the Programme in Spain.

As part of these advisory services, the CDTI has a <u>mock</u> <u>interview service</u> dedicated exclusively to Spanish companies participating in the EIC Accelerator.
